

ADVANCED MEDIATION TRAINING

Working with Nonparty Participants in Mediation

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

Individuals who are interested in learning how to mediate cases in a court setting.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Ohio's Uniform Mediation Act allows a party to designate an attorney or other individual to accompany the party and participate in mediation. Since the UMA's adoption in 2005, mediators have had a range of experiences with nonparty participants in mediation. Some of these experiences are positive, others are not. In this course, attendees will explore how mediators can work effectively with nonparty participants. This course will address the role of the nonparty participant in mediation, the pros and cons of nonparty participants in mediation,

how a mediator can foster positive interaction with nonparty participants and what a mediator can do when the nonparty participants present difficult challenges in mediation.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

- Describe the role of nonparty participants in mediation
- Identify nonparty participant behavior that is helpful or is challenging,
- Describe strategies a mediator may use to address challenging behaviors of a non-party participant
- Demonstrate one strategy a mediator may use to address nonparty participation that is challenging.
